"He will be like a tree firmly planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in its season and its leaf does not wither; and in whatever he does, he prospers." (Psalm 1:3)

"Whatever the Lord pleases, He does, in heaven and in earth, in the seas and in all deeps." (Psalm 135:6)  
"Pray to the Lord our God; and whatever the Lord our God says, tell us so, and we will do it." (Jeremiah 42:20)

"Whatever you devise against the Lord, He will make a complete end of it. Distress will not rise up twice." (Nahum 1:9)

"If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you." (John 15:7)

"...and whatever is not from faith is sin." (Romans 14:23)

"For whatever was written in earlier times was written for our instruction, so that through perseverance and the encouragement of Scripture we might have hope." (Romans 15:4)

"Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God." (I Corinthians 10:31)
