## **Heart to Heart...**

Too many are squandering their lives by not taking advantage of opportunities presented. It is all about choices that are made. The choices: sleep in on Sunday or worship in spirit and truth. Attend a bible study class opportunity or not interested. The choices: spend time in prayer or time to catch up on sleep. It seems some just don't believe their lives are really headed to eternity or they wouldn't be making some of the choices in their lives.

I would encourage each of us, read Hebrews 11 and carefully note those of faith, a saving faith, which was God approved. Listen to one aspect of those of faith: ***"All these died in faith, without receiving the promises, but having seen them and having welcomed them from a distance and having confessed that they were strangers and exiles on earth. For those who say such things make it clear they are seeking a country of their own."*** (Hebrews 11:13-14) They **"make it clear"**! That's what saving faith does, makes certain what is sought in their life. When one makes it clear, they make proper choices. These faithful men and women lived richly blessed lives even amidst their struggles and pains. They were looking, focusing and reaching for the eternal country that God promised. We fill our time with innumerable obligations, clubs, organizations, commitments and entertainment. Our energies are

expended on all this and when it comes to choosing spiritual things, those pass by the way with little serious thought! And our children are learning from us well. The result is that many become frazzled and their faith just slowly erodes away.

Do you believe in life after death? We should because Jesus is alive!! We need our hope in God. We need to believe in life before death!! That's where we stumble. We have a great capacity for adventure, enjoyment and excitement but many are just squandering their lives away in these forms of death. That's why many are not living life here and wasting many spiritual opportunities. The things we choose to involve ourselves in and what we put our efforts toward reveal what we really believe.
