Heart to Heart...

To worship the Almighty Jehovah is a grace-given privilege. I know many may not see it that way. The worship of Jehovah God is awesome. Worship to some is duty. It’s not about speaking spiritual joy as fun and ball-game atmosphere. Worship is love being expressed from the heart giving to God what God wants, keeping God at the center. Worship is not a production of drama. Worship is to please the Lord Jehovah in all respects.

When true reverence from the heart for the Lord is being offered, honor will be the result. Just listen when the world honors fallen soldiers that sacrificed for our country, they don’t act jubilant and break out into all sorts of loud outbursts but there is a soberness of mind and heart. Worship is not a duty or task but honoring the presence of the Almighty! Worship is giving, not receiving (Hebrews 13:15). Worship is sacrifice! Worship is an offering! When one assembles with the saints and says they get nothing out of worship, what are they really saying? They have little to offer! Therefore, because their sacrifice is lacking, they leave just as lacking. Our singing is a sacrifice! Our prayers are a sacrifice! Worship is completely God centered. He is the audience and is examining our hearts by listening to and looking at the sacrifice we offer. It is all the result
